"An Ordinance Prohibiting owner, proprietor, Manager or employee of a pool room or Billiard Hall in the town of Oelbenton from permitting Minors under the age of eighteen years to play, resort, or stop therein, and providing a penalty for violation thereof" was presented and read.

Declaring that an emergency existed and that said Ordinance should take effect immediately Ordinance #52 was introduced and read Moved by Alderman, Moore seconded by Alderman Moore that the consent of all of the members

of the council present be granted for the immediate consideration and final passage of the ordinance, Carried, Moved by Alderman Donaldson seconded by Alderman Moore that the Ordinance be finally passed - Carried.

On Roll call all the Aldermen present to-vot - Alderman Donaldson, Moore - Moore voted Aye - None - None - Absent and not voting None.

Whereupon the Mayor declared said Ordinance duly passed.

Ordinance # 52 - reads as follows:

Be it ordained by the Council of the town of Culbertson: Section 1. Every Owner, proprietor, manager, or employee of a pool or billiard hall in the town of Culbertson who permits a minor under the age of eighteen years to play, resort, or stop therein is guilty of violation of the Ordinance of the Town of Culbertson, and this Ordinance, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) or by imprisonment of not more than ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment."
