Ordinance # 53 Entitled "An Ordinance to amend ordinance # 38 of the Town of Colubaton Rowlett County, Montana" Entitled -
"An Ordinance providing for licensing persons engaged in occupations, Professions, and Trades in the Town of Colubaton, Fixing the rates of such licenses, and providing penalties for violation thereof."

Ordinance # 44

It is ordained by the Council of the Town of Culbertson:

Section I. No person or persons, firms or Corporations shall carry on or engage in any of the following occupations, trades or professions in the Town of Culbertson, Roosevelt County, Montana, without a license therefor from said town and every person, firm or Corporation carrying on any of the businesses, trades, or professions hereinafter enumerated, in the town of Culbertson, shall, at the beginning of every quarter from of the Town Treasurer at his office, a license to carry on such business, trade or profession, as he or they may engage in.

Section 2.

The rate of such license shall be as follows:

Section 3.


Any person, firm or corporation who shall transact any business, trade, occupation or profession for which a license is required by this ordinance, without first procuring a license therefor as provided herein shall be deemed guilty of a violation of this ordinance, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to which shall be added the amount due from such person, firm or corporation for such license.







A RESOLUTION FIXING THE TAX LEVY FOR MUNICIPAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE PURPOSES FOR THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, COUNTY OF ROOSEVELT, STATE OF MONTANA FOR THE YEAR 1927.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA:

WHEREAS the indebtedness of the town of Culbertson, Montana exceeds one (1) per cent of the assessed value of all taxable property in said town of Culbertson and it is therefore necessary to levy and fix the SPECIAL TAX to defray such municipal and administrative indebtedness as can not be provided for out of the General Fund,-

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the town of Culbertson, County of Roosevelt, and State of Montana, that a Special tax is hereby declared and levied for the town of Culbertson, Montana, for the ensuing year, and that said tax be and the same is hereby fixed and assessed and levied at twenty-four (24) mills on each dollar of taxable property within the corporate limits of said town of Culbertson.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Council of the town of Culbertson, that the amount of said tax for each of said municipal and administrative purpose is hereby designated as follows:

Ninteen (19) mills to the WATER FUND for indebtedness to become due during the ensuing year; Five (5) mills to be paid into the SINKING FUND of said town, and for the redemption of the Water Works Bonds of said town of Culbertson, and each of said special taxes when collected shall be used for no other purpose that the expenses incurred as above stated, for the purpose for which said special tax is levied, and not otherwise.
