
BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Town of Culbertson, County

were illegally levied and assessed, and


WHEREAS said railway company is entitled to the

levied and assessed, for said year.






BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA:

A RESOLUTION FIXING THE TAX LEVY FOR MUNICIPAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE PURPOSES FOR THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, COUNTY OF ROOSEVELT, STATE OF MONTANA FOR THE YEAR 1928.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA:

WHEREAS the indebtedness of the town of Culbertson, Montana exceeds one (1) per cent of the assessed value of the taxable property in said town of Culbertson, and it is therefore necessary to levy and fix the SPECIAL TAX to defray such municipal and administrative indebtedness as can not be provided for out of the general fund,-

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the town of Culbertson, County of Roosevelt and State of Montana, that a Special tax is hereby declared and levied for the town of Culbertson Montana, for the ensuing year and that said tax be and the same is hereby fixed and assessed and levied at twenty-four (24) mills on each dollar of taxable property within the corporate limits of said town of culbertson.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY The Council of the town of Culbertson, that the amount of said tax for each of said municipal and administrative purposes is hereby designated as follows:

Nineteen (19) mills to the WATER FUND for indebtedness to become due during the ensuing year; Five (5) mills to be paid into the sinking fund of said town and for the redemption of the Water Works Bonds of said town of Culbertson, and each of said special taxes when collected shall be used for no other purpose than the expenses incurred as above stated, for the purpose for which said special tax is levied and not otherwise.

ORDINANCE NO. 54

An Ordinance providing for the Redemption of Thirty-nine Thousand Five Hundred Dollars of the outstanding maturing bonds of the Town of Culbertson, by issuing refunding bonds of said Town in the amount of Thirty-nine Thousand Five Hundred Dollars, to bear date November 1, A. D. 1928, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the Town of Culbertson, Montana, has outstanding valid maturing water bonds to the sum of thirty-nine thousand five hundred dollars (\$39,500) bearing interest at the rate of six per centum per annum, dated July 15, 1911, optional July 15, 1921, and absolutely due July 15, 1931; and

WHEREAS, there is not and will not be sufficient money to the credit of said town applicable to pay any of said bonds when due; and

WHEREAS, in the judgment of the Town Council, to levy and collect a tax for the purpose of paying said bonds when due would be a hardship and a burden to said town and the inhabitants thereof; and

WHEREAS, the owner of said bonds has offered to exchange the same for refunding bonds of the town bearing interest at the rate of five and one-quarter per centum per annum, payable serially in the years 1929 to 1948 inclusive, said owner having refused to accept refunding bonds payable on the amortization plan except at a higher rate of interest; and

WHEREAS, the issuance and exchange of said refunding bonds will effect a substantial saving in interest, and will in other respects be advantageous to the town:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Town of Culbertson, Montana:

Section 1. That a refunding bonds in the name of the Town of Culbertson shall be issued in the aggregate amount of thirty-nine thousand five hundred dollars, for the purpose of providing the necessary funds to pay valid maturing bonds of the town now outstanding and redeemable at the option of the town, as recited in the preamble hereof.

Section 2. That under and by virtue of the provisions of Section 5228 of the Revised Codes of Montana, 1921, the Town of Culbertson, Roosevelt County, Montana, shall issue its negotiable coupon bonds in the aggregate sum of thirty-nine thousand five hundred dollars, for the purpose of refunding a like amount of its outstanding valid bonded indebtedness, said bonds to be designated "REFUNDING TOWN BONDS," and shall be issued in denominations of \$1000 and \$500, numbered from 1 to 47 inclusive, shall be dated November 1, 1928, and shall become payable and redeemable serially as follows: Bonds numbered 1 to 3 inclusive, in the denomination of \$500 each, due November 1, 1929; bonds numbered 4 to 19 inclusive, in the denomination of \$1000 each, due \$2000 on November 1st in each of the years 1930 to 1937 inclusive; bonds numbered 20 to 31 inclusive in the denomination of \$500 each, due \$2000 on November 1st in each of the years 1938 to 1940 inclusive; and bonds numbered 32 to 47 inclusive, in the denomination of \$1000 each, due \$2000 on November 1st in each of the years 1941 to 1948 inclusive; said bonds to bear interest at the rate of five and one-quarter per centum per annum, payable semiannually, and the principal and interest on said bonds shall be payable at the office of the Town Treasurer, in Culbertson, Montana, or at the National City Bank, the fiscal agent of the State of Montana, in the City and State of New York, at the option of the holder. Said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and Clerk of said Town of Culbertson, and coupons shall be attached to each bond evidencing the semiannual interest accruing thereon, which coupons shall be signed by the engraved facsimile of the signatures of the Mayor and Clerk, and when so executed shall be taken to be the valid obligations of said town, as evidencing the semiannual interest accruing upon said bonds; the corporate seal of the town shall be affixed to each bond, and each bond so issued shall be registered by the Town Clerk in a book provided for that purpose, which shall show the date, number term and amount of each bond, and the person or persons to

whom the bonds are issued.

Section 3. That the said bonds and the coupons thereto attached shall be in substantially the following form:

The Town of Culbertson, in the State of Montana, acknowledges itself indebted and hereby promises to pay to bearer

lawful money of the United States of America, on the first day of November, A. D., 19____, with interest thereon at the rate of five and one-quarter per centum per annum, payable semi-annually, on the first day of May and the first day of November in each year, upon the presentation and surrender of the annexed coupons as they severally become due, both principal and interest payable at the office of the Town Treasurer, in the Town of Culbertson, Montana, or at the National City Bank, the fiscal agent for the State of Montana, in the City and State of New York, U. S. A., at the option of the holder.

This bond is issued for the purpose of providing funds to pay valid maturing optional and outstanding bonds of said Town of Culbertson, under, by virtue of and in full conformity with Section 5288 of the Revised Codes of Montana, 1921, the Constitution of said state, and all other laws thereunto enabling; and it is hereby certified that all the requirements of law have been fully complied with by the proper officers in issuing this bond.

It is further certified that the total indebtedness of the Town of Culbertson, including this bond and the indebtedness refunded hereby, does not exceed any limit prescribed by the Constitution or laws of the State of Montana.

Section 4. The principal of and the interest on said refunding bonds which becomes due in the year A. D. 1929, shall be paid from the proceeds of tax levies heretofore made or from other available funds. In each of the years 1929 to 1947 inclusive, there shall be levied on all the taxable property in said town, in addition to all other taxes, a tax sufficient to pay one year's interest on all of said refunding bonds outstanding, and an additional tax sufficient to pay \$2000 principal each year.

The taxing and collecting officers of said town are hereby authorized and required to levy and cause to be extended and collected such tax annually as shall become necessary for the purpose aforesaid, and due under this ordinance, and the said taxes, when collected, shall be applied only to the payment of said interest and principal of said bonds, respectively, and for no other purpose whatsoever, until said bonds authorized by this ordinance, both principal and interest, shall be fully paid, satisfied and discharged. And the sums hereinbefore provided for to meet the interest on said bonds and to discharge the principal thereof, when due, are hereby appropriated for that purpose, and said amounts for each year shall also be included in the annual appropriation bills passed by the Town Council of said city in each of said years successively.

Section 5. When said refunding bonds have been prepared and executed, they shall be exchanged at par for a like amount of said outstanding maturing bonds, in such manner that the total debt of said town shall at no time be increased, whereupon the said bonds now outstanding shall be cancelled and destroyed.
