WHEREAS the records of the Town Treasurer of the Town of Culbertson show the sum of \$ 12,151.36 in the Singking Fund of said town which fund was established for the purpose of retiring Water Works Bonds of 1911, maturing in 1931, and

WHEREAS said water works bonds of 1911 were refunded by the Water Works Refunding Issue of 1929 in the amount of \$39,500.00 being the total amount of said original issue and said funds still remain to the credit of said town in said sinking fund, and

WHEREAS the funds know as the General Fund, the Water Fund and the Special Fund, are carried on the books of said Town Treasurer deficient in the respective amounts of \$ 1223.73 and \$4149.25 and \$ 3600.08,



Bruggen and upon an eye and nay vote duly had and recorded, was adopted by the unanimous eye vote of all councilmen present at said meeting, as recited hereinbefore in these minutes; there being no votes nay, whereupon such resolution was declared by the Mayor to be adopted and the same was signed and approved and attested at the end thereof as set forth hereinafter in these minutes; which said resolution is as follows:

RESOLUTION NO. 50.

WHEREAS, the Town of Culbertson, Montana, has heretofore advertised for sale its proposed warrant funding bond issue of \$18,733.98, payable on the amortization plan as prescribed by Chapter 38 of the Laws of Montana of 1923, if such bonds can be sold and disposed of at a reasonable rate of interest, or otherwise payable serially in the event that such amortization bonds cannot thus be sold; and,

WHEREAS, it further appears that such amortization bonds cannot be negotiated at such reasonable rate of interest advantageous to the people and inhabitants of said Town of Culbertson, Montana; and,

WHEREAS, this Town Council in considering the bids for said bonds has taken into account the rate of interest offered or demanded on said bonds, the rate of interest which can be realized on the sinking funds as may be required for the payment of serial bonds, and also every other known element affecting the total cost of said bonds when paid in full, and has fully taken into consideration all the matters and things required thus to be taken into consideration by this Town Council in connection with the consideration of bids for said bonds, and as required by the provisions of said Chapter 38 of the Laws of Montana of 1923; and,

WHEREAS, this Town Council has determined that serial bonds, as heretofore advertised for sale in the totality of their effect, are the most advantageous to the Town of Culbertson in view of the bid made therefore, and which is accepted herein, and in view of all the matters and things hereinbefore referred to,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED AND DETERMINED AS FOLLOWS:

1. That amortization bonds cannot be negotiated at any reasonable rate of interest advantageous to the Town of Culbertson, Montana, and that serial bonds, as heretofore advertised for sale, are in the totality of their effect the most advantageous to be issued by said Town of Culbertson, and that such serial bonds, as heretofore advertised, should be issued and sold.

2. That the bid of Heath Ackerman & Co. of Denver, State of Colorado, for the purchase of said bonds at the interest rate of 5 3/4% per annum is the best and most advantageous bid received for said bonds and the said bid is hereby accepted and the said bonds are hereby awarded and sold unto said bidder in accordance with the terms of the notice of sale and the terms of said bid, and the proper officials of this Town are hereby authorized and directed to execute and issue said bonds and to deliver the same unto said purchaser upon ^{payment of the} the remainder of the purchase price for said bonds by said purchaser.

3. That the place of payment of said bonds, having heretofore been designated by the Treasurer of the Town of Culbertson as at the office of the Treasurer of said Town in Culbertson, Montana, the said place of payment of the bonds and interest coupons attached thereto is hereby fixed at said place and the rate of interest which said bonds shall bear is hereby fixed in accordance with the terms of said bid.

4. The Mayor, Town Clerk and Town Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to furnish to said purchaser such certified records, writings, or documents necessary to the completion

of a proper transcript of bond proceedings relating to the ordering and issuance of said bonds as may be required by Burcham & Blair, bond attorneys of Spokane, Washington, to the end that an approving opinion of said bonds shall be obtained.

5. Said serial bonds hereby sold shall mature and be payable in numerical order in 38 bonds, numbers 1 to 38, both inclusive, bond No. 1 being of the denomination of \$233.98, and all other bonds being of the denomination of \$500.00 each; and said bonds shall mature and be payable according to their terms according to the following schedule, viz;



A RESOLUTION SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED FREE-HOLDERS RESIDING WITHIN THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, ROOSEVELT COUNTY, MONTANA, AND WHOSE NAMES APPEAR ON THE TOWN OR COUNTY TAX ROLL NEXT PRECEDING THE ANNUAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION, THE QUESTION OF GRANTING TO THE BOWDOIN UTILITIES COMPANY, A DELAWARE CORPORATION, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, A FRANCHISE TO CONSTRUCT, MAINTAIN AND OPERATE WITHIN AND UPON, IN AND UNDER THE STREETS, ALLEYS AND PUBLIC GROUNDS OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, ROOSEVELT COUNTY, MONTANA, A DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM OF MAINS AND SERVICE PIPES, TOGETHER WITH ALL APPARATUS, MACHINERY AND EQUIPMENT, INCIDENTAL THERETO, FOR DISTRIBUTING NATURAL OR ARTIFICIAL GAS, OR A MIXTURE OF BOTH, FOR PUBLIC AND PRIVATE USE AND SALE AND DEFINING THE EXTENT AND CONDITIONS OF SUCH RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES, AND INSTRUCTING THE TOWN CLERK IN REFERENCE TO SAID ELECTION ACCORDING TO LAW.

WHEREAS, the Bowdoin Utilities Company, a Delaware corporation, has heretofore made application to the Town of Culbertson, Roosevelt County, Montana, for a franchise to construct, maintain and operate within and upon, in and under, the streets, alleys and public grounds of the Town of Culbertson, Roosevelt County, Montana, a distribution system of mains and service pipes, together with all apparatus, machinery and equipment, incidental thereto, for distributing natural or artificial gas, or a mixture of both, for public and private use and sale and defining the extent and conditions of such rights and privileges, and has submitted to the Town Council of the said Town of Culbertson, a proposed franchise, which if adopted and approved, will grant such a franchise to the said Bowdoin Utilities Company, its successors and assigns, and it is the judgment and opinion of the Council of the said Town of Culbertson, that said application for such a franchise should be submitted to the resident freeholders of the said Town of Culbertson, whose names appear on the Town or County tax roll next preceding the holding of the annual municipal election for their approval or rejection, as provided by the Statutes of the State of Montana.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Town of Culbertson, Roosevelt County, Montana, at the annual municipal election to be held on the 6th day of April, A. D. 1931, there be submitted to the duly qualified resident freeholders residing within the said Town of Culbertson, Roosevelt County, Montana, whose names appear on the town or county tax roll next preceding such election, the following question, to-wit:

"QUESTION: Shall the Council of the Town of Culbertson, Roosevelt County, Montana, grant to the Bowdoin Utilities Company, a Delaware corporation, its successors and assigns, a franchise to construct, maintain and operate within and upon, in and under, the streets, alleys and public grounds of the Town of Culbertson, Roosevelt County, Montana, a distribution system of mains and service pipes, together with all apparatus, machinery and equipment, incidental thereto, for distributing natural or artificial gas, or a mixture of both, for public and private use and sale and defining the extent and conditions of such rights and privileges, pursuant to the application of the said Bowdoin Utilities Company, now on file in the office of the Town Clerk of the said Town of Culbertson"?

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk be and hereby is duly authorized, empowered and directed to give or cause to be given due notice of the holding of said election, and of the submission at said election of the said question, and of the closing of registration for said election, and the submission of said question to the voters at said election, to prepare the necessary ballots, to hold and conduct said election and to do and to perform, or cause to be done and performed, all necessary acts in connection therewith, as provided and required by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said question shall be submitted as hereinbefore provided at said annual municipal election, at the usual and regular voting places in each precinct, and that the judges and clerks for and of said annual municipal election shall officiate, and that the returns shall be canvassed at the time and in the manner provided by law.
