RESOLUTION NO. 70.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF SUCH BONDS OR CONTRACTS ON BEHALF OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA. AS SHALL BE NECESSARY AND AS MAY BE APPROVED BY THE UNITED STATES FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROCURING A WATER SUPPLY AND RECONSTRUCTING AND ADDING TO THE WATER SYSTEM OF SAID TOWN, ^{which water supply and water system said town} SHALL OWN AND CONTROL, AND THE REVENUES DERIVED THEREFROM SHALL BE DEVOTED TO THE PAYMENT OF THE DEBT INCURRED THEREFOR.

WHEREAS, the present water system of the Town of Culbertson is inadequate to supply the needs of the Town of Culbertson by reason of frequent leaks in the mains due to erosion, defective joints, unsuitable and defective wooden main all of said mains and pipes being weakened to such an extent by reason of the condition of corrosion, wear and tear that said system will not supply a sufficient volume or pressure of water to meet the ordinary needs of said town, and

WHEREAS the Town Council has determined that the entire system should be reconstructed, new mains should be installed; the pumping house and system should be reconstructed and relocated and the storage facilities repaired and a modern chlorination plant installed according to plans now on file in the office of the town clerk of said town, all of which said reconstruction, installations, additions and repairs are necessary and essential and to the best interests of the town of Culbertson, and

WHEREAS ~~due to the weakened and defective condition of said water system~~ the cost of maintenance and repair of same is far in excess of the revenue derived by said town from said system, and

WHEREAS it has been estimated that the cost of the reconstruction

installations, improvements and additions to said water system will amount to the sum of \$58,700.00, and that to provide funds for such purpose it is necessary to borrow money or contract indebtedness by issuing bonds of said town under its powers as set forth in subdivision 64 of Section 5039 Revised Codes of Montana, 1921 and H. B. No. 19 of the Special Legislative Session 1933,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA

That it is deemed necessary and for the best interests of the Town of Culbertson, Montana, by the Town Council that said town reconstruct and install additions to and improve the water system owned by the town of Culbertson by rebuilding and relocating the pumping plant, and installing new machinery therein, reconstructing the present system by the installation of modern chlorination plant and extending feeder mains and installing new feeder mains with necessary connections and hydrants.

That said Town shall be authorized and is hereby authorized to execute such bonds or contracts as shall be necessary and as may be approved by the United States to construct, finance, or aid in the construction or financing of said project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That an emergency exists in which it is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety that this Resolution shall become effective immediately, and

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, That this Resolution shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
