Ordinance number 60

An ordinance establishing regulations for the prevention and control of atmospheric disturbances of radio receiving and broadcasting within the limits of the city of Culbertson, Montana, and fixing the penalty for the violation thereof, and declaring an emergency.

Section #1 It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, within the limits of the city of Culbertson, Montana, to willfully and unnecessarily disturb radio receiving and broadcasting by electric

Ordinance number 60

An ordinance establishing regulations for the prevention and control of atmospheric disturbances of radio receiving and broadcasting within the limits of the city of Culbertson, Montana, and fixing the penalty for the violation thereof, and declaring an emergency.

Section #1 It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, within the limits of the city of Culbertson, Montana, to fallfully and unnecessarily disturb radio receiving and broadcasting, by electrically disturbing the atmosphere by any means or device whatsoever not necessarily incident to the operation of machinery or apperatus necessarily used in connection with a lawfull business or occupation.

Section #2 That section one hereof shall include and cover any electrical disturbance of the atmosphere caused by any person or persons operating any electrical light plant, dynamo, appliances, devices or machinery operating in connection with electricity, and knowingly maintaining and operating the same in such a manner so as to ~~unn~~ unnecessarily cause an electrical disturbance of the atmosphere to such an extent as to intefere with the receptions of programs broadcasted by radio.

Section #3 Provides for the free and unhindered examination of any and all electrical appliances, by an authorised person, appointed by the city council, at any reasonable hour~~s~~.

Section #4 Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, be fined not less than ten dollars, or more than one hundred dollars, or be confined in jail for a period not exceeding thirty days.

Section #5 An emergency is hereby declared to exist in that there is not now an ordinance dealing with the subject mentioned in the prese ding sections, and it is necessary for the peace and quiet of the city of Culbertson, Montana, and the health and safety of its inhabitants that this ordinance be in full force and effect inmediately after its passage by the city council and approved by the mayor.
