Mr Miller explained Kalman & Co.'s plan after which it was discussed by the council.

Mr O.F. Aplin moved to recind the resolution of July 12, 1944 regarding Kalman & Co.'s proposel of refinancing entire bond structure, this was seconded by E.E. Bonebright said motion carried.

Moved by Alderman O.F. Aplin, seconded by C.C. Funk that the proposel to refinance outstanding bonds of the town of Culbertson submitted to the town board on Jan. 22, 1945 ~~xxxxxxxxxxxx~~ by Kalman & Co. as evidenced by their written proposal dated Jan. 10, 1945 which proposal is made part of this resolution be hereby accepted. Motion carried.



Pursuant to due call and notice thereof a Special meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson, Roosevelt County, Montana, was duly held in the Council Chambers in said Town on the 22 day of January, 1945, at 2 o'clock P.M.

Alderman O.F. Aplin introduced the following resolution and

A RESOLUTION RELATING TO THE  
ISSUANCE OF \$60,000 REFUNDING BONDS.

WHEREAS the Town of Culbertson heretofore issued and now has outstanding and unpaid the following described bonds, viz.:

- (a) \$24,000 principal amount of Refunding Bonds dated November 1, 1928, bearing interest at 5½% per annum payable semiannually on May 1 and November 1 of each year, which bonds matured or will mature in the amount of \$2000 on November 1 in each of the years 1937 to 1948, inclusive, and on which interest accrued to January 1, 1945, remains unpaid in a total amount of \$2021.25, all of which bonds were issued to refund validly issued and outstanding water bonds of the Town, which water bonds were issued pursuant to a vote of the taxpayers affected thereby to extend the 3% debt limit of the Town as authorized by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Montana then in force;
- (b) \$36,517.77 principal amount of Waterworks Improvement Bonds dated September 1, 1934, bearing interest at 4% per annum payable semiannually on March 1 and September 1 of each year, of which principal amount \$2017.77 became due September 1, 1939, and \$2300 on September 1 in each of the years 1940 through 1944, and of which \$23,000 will fall due in amounts of \$2300 on September 1 in each of the years 1945 through 1954, which unmatured bonds became callable for redemption at the option of the Town on September 1, 1944, and on each interest payment date thereafter, and on which \$36,517.77 of bonds interest accrued to January 1, 1945, remains unpaid in a total amount of \$834.81, and which Waterworks Improvement Bonds were issued pursuant to vote of the taxpayers affected thereby to extend the 3% debt limit of the Town as authorized by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Montana then in force, including Chapter 24 Laws of the Extraordinary Session of the 23d Legislative Assembly and acts amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto; and

WHEREAS the Town has received an offer from Allison-Williams Company, of Minneapolis, Minnesota, to purchase \$60,000 principal amount of Refunding Bonds of the Town dated as of January 1, 1945, to bear interest at 2½% per annum, payable semiannually on January 1 and July 1 of each year, said bonds to become due and payable serially in the amount of \$3000 on January 1 in each of the years 1946 to 1965, both inclusive, those maturing after January 1, 1950, to be redeemable at par at the option of the Town on July 1, 1950, and on any interest payment date thereafter, said offer being to purchase said bonds at par and accrued interest, subject to approval as to legality by their bond attorneys; and

WHEREAS the Town has available funds to pay all the accrued interest on said Refunding Bonds dated November 1, 1928, and \$517.77 on the principal and all the accrued interest on said Waterworks Improvement Bonds dated September 1, 1934; and

WHEREAS a substantial saving to the Town and its taxpayers can be effected by accepting said offer and refunding and paying said outstanding indebtedness above described;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council of the Town of Glendora, Montana, as follows:

1. Each and all of the facts set forth in the preamble to this resolution are hereby found, determined, and declared to be true and correct, and said preamble is hereby made a part of this resolution.

2. The Town shall forthwith issue its negotiable coupon Refunding Bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$60,000, said bonds to be 60 in number and numbered from 1 to 60, both inclusive, each in the denomination of \$1000, to bear interest at the rate of 2½% per annum, payable semiannually on the 1st day of January and 1st day of July of each year, said bonds to be dated January 1, 1945, and to mature serially, in order of serial numbers, lowest numbers first, in the amount of \$3000 on January 1 in each of the years 1946 to 1965, both inclusive, those maturing after January 1, 1950 (being bonds bearing serial numbers 16 to 60, both inclusive), to be subject to redemption at par at the option of the Town on July 1, 1950, and on any interest payment date thereafter, but bonds numbered 1 to 15, inclusive, to be payable as aforesaid, without option of prior payment. Both principal of and interest on said bonds shall be payable at the main office of the Northwestern National Bank of Minneapolis, in Minneapolis, Minnesota. For the prompt and full payment of each and all of said bonds and the interest thereon as such principal and interest become due, the full faith, credit, and taxing powers of the Town shall be and are hereby irrevocably pledged.

3. Said Refunding Bonds of January 1, 1945, and the interest coupons to be thereto attached shall be in substantially the following form:

The clauses "(or on a date prior thereto on which this bond shall have been called for redemption)" and "(or until such redemption date)" in the first paragraph of the bond form set out below are to be omitted from bonds numbered 1 to 15, inclusive.

The clause "(unless called for earlier redemption)" in the form of coupon set out below is to be omitted from coupons which become due on or before January 1, 1950.

9. This resolution is immediately necessary for the peace, health, and safety of said Town, wherefore Culbertson, Montana and this resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and approval.

4. Said bonds shall be prepared under the direction of the Town Clerk and shall be executed on behalf of the Town by the signature of the Mayor and Treasurer, attested by the Town Clerk, and sealed with its corporate seal; and the interest coupons thereto attached shall be executed and authenticated by the lithographic or engraved facsimile signatures of said officers; and said bonds shall be registered by the Town Treasurer in the manner required by law; and when said bonds have been fully executed and registered as so required they shall be delivered by the Treasurer to Allison-Williams Company, of Minneapolis, Minnesota, upon receipt of the purchase price thereof, being the face amount of said bonds plus accrued interest thereon to the date of such payment and delivery, and the purchaser shall not be required to see to the application of said purchase price.

In so far as possible, they shall pay and redeem the outstanding bonds to be refunded in accordance herewith simultaneously with the delivery of said Refunding Bonds of 1945 or as soon as possible thereafter. Any and all of said presently outstanding bonds which have not yet matured, but are redeemable, shall be and are hereby called for payment and redemption on the first redemption date applicable thereto occurring hereafter, and the Clerk and Treasurer are authorized to give notice thereof in the manner prescribed by law; provided that any of such bonds may be paid upon surrender thereof by their holders for such purpose in advance of the dates on which they are called for redemption.

6. In order to provide money for the prompt and full payment of principal of and interest on said Refunding Bonds of 1945 as such principal and interest respectively become due, there shall be and is hereby ordered and directed to be levied and collected an annual tax which shall be sufficient, with other revenues available therefor, to pay the interest on said bonds as the same becomes due and to provide a sinking fund for payment of the principal of said bonds at their respective maturities, and it is hereby made the duty of the proper officers to see to the levy and collection of such taxes sufficient in amount for said purposes and to cause the proceeds of such levies to be applied in payment of such principal and interest.

7. The proceeds of said levies, when and as collected, and other sums which shall hereafter be appropriated, shall be placed in a sinking fund, which is hereby created, to be known as "Sinking Fund of \$60,000 Refunding Bonds of 1945", and shall be used for no other purpose than to pay the principal and interest of said bonds; provided that if at any time any payment of principal or interest shall become due when there is not sufficient money in said Sinking Fund for the payment thereof, such principal or interest shall be paid from any funds of the Town available therefor, and such funds shall be reimbursed for such advances out of the proceeds of levies thereafter collected.

8. The County Clerk and Recorder and the Mayor, Town Clerk and Town Treasurer are authorized and directed to furnish to the purchaser of said bonds and to their attorneys certified copies of all proceedings relating to the issuance of such bonds and such other certified copies, certificates, and affidavits as may be required to show the right, power, and authority of the Town to issue said bonds; and all facts stated in and shown by such instruments, including any heretofore furnished, shall be deemed representations of the Town.

9. This resolution is immediately necessary for the preservation of the peace, health, and safety of said Town, wherefore an emergency exists and this resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and approval.
