RESOLUTION NO 129

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON MONTANA, ESTABLISHING A AIRPORT BOARD OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA AND AUTHORIZING SUCH BOARD TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENT WITH THE AIRPORT BOARD OF THE COUNTY OF ROOSEVELT, MONTANA, FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT, ACQUISITION, OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF AN AIRPORT AND AIR NAVIGATION FACILITIES NEAR THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON MONTANA.

WHEREAS, the Town of Culbertson, Montana desires to establish a joint airport with the County of Roosevelt, Montana;

WHEREAS, The Town of Culbertson, Montana desires to jointly operate such established airport with the County of Roosevelt, Montana;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson Montana;

1. That a Culbertson Board is hereby established, to consist of three members, appointed by the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson Montana, with one member to serve for a one year term, one member to serve a two year term, and one member to serve a three year term, and their successors each to serve for a three year term, so that one new member shall be appointed each year, members may succeed them-selves by appointment.

2. That said Culbertson Airport Board shall be vested with authority for planning, establishment, development, construction, enlargement, improvement, maintenance, equipment, operation, regulation, protection, and policing of airports or other navigation facilities established, owned or controlled by the Town of Culbertson, Montana, and may jointly act with the Roosevelt County Airport Board for such purposes, with approval of the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson Montana.

3. The said Culbertson Airport Board may elect one of its members to serve as Chairman, and such Board shall keep such records as are determined to be necessary by the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson, Montana.

4. The Town Council of the Town of Culbertson shall make such appropriations, and raise said money through taxation or otherwise, as is necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution, within limitations prescribed by law.

RESOLUTION NO.130

together with a tract at a point 306' South and 40' West of the NE corner of the NW1/4 of Section 29, Twp. 28 N., Rge. 56 E. N. M. A RESOLUTION DECLARING IT TO BE THE INTENTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA, TO CREATE SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT LIGHTING DISTRICT NO. IN THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF LIGHTING THE STREETS WITHIN THE TOWN LIMITS OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA:

SECTION I: That public interest and convenience require and it is deemed necessary to order and create, and the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson, Montana, intends to order and create a special improvement lighting district with the number, the boundaries and the character of the improvements to be made as are hereafter set forth.

SECTION II: It is the intention of the Town Council of Culbertson, Montana, to create and establish in said Town a special improvement district for the purpose of Lighting the streets within the Town of Culbertson and to pay for the maintenance of and the supplying of electrical current to a lighting system to be installed as hereinafter set forth.

SECTION III: That the number of said special improvement district is hereby designated as "Special Improvement Lighting District No. 1 of the Town of Culbertson, Montana".

SECTION IV: It is the opinion of the Town Council of Culbertson, Montana, that such contemplated work is of more than local or ordinary public benefit and that such work and improvement and the maintenance and supplying of electrical current to such system should be chargeable upon the entire platted portion within the limits of the Town of Culbertson, and that hereafter set forth are the boundaries of said Special Improvement Lighting District and such property within such boundaries is hereby declared to be the district benefited by such work and improvements and the maintenance and supplying of electrical current thereto and to be assessed to pay the costs of maintenance and supplying of electrical current thereto, as follows:

North Side Addition

All lots in Blocks 1, 2, 3, & 4.

Bruegger Addition

All lots in Blocks 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10,11,12,13,14,15,16.

Nugent Addition

All lots in Blocks 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8.

Cushings First Addition

All lots in Blocks 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9.

Cushings Second Addition

Lots 1 through 27 inclusive, of Block 1; Lots 1 through 5 inclusive, of Block 2; All lots in Block 3; Lots 1 through 23 inclusive, of Block 4; plus the South 65 feet of Outlet 1, Block 1.

Courchene's Third Addition

SECTION VII: That the Montana Dakota Utilities Company shall install such improvements without cost to the Town of Culbertson, the said Company to own said installation and improvements, and the yearly maintenance, operating costs and costs of supplying electrical current therefor for the first year is estimated to be \$4761.13.

SECTION VIII: That the costs of maintenance, operation and supplying of electrical current to said lighting system shall be paid twenty-five per cent (25%) by the Town of Culbertson, and the balance of seventy-five per cent (75%) will be assessed to the property owners within the district to be established, payable annually on a pro-rated basis equally according to the ratio each lot bears to the entire area included within the district, exclusive of streets, avenues, alleys and public places.

SECTION IX: That on Tuesday, the 3rd day of September A.D. 1963, at the Town Council Chambers in the Town Hall in the Town of Culbertson, Montana, at 8 o'clock P.M. the Council of said Town of Culbertson, Montana, intends to create said special improvement lighting district and will hear objections to the same, at which time and place any person or persons who are owners or agents of owners of any lot or parcel of land in said Special Improvement Lighting District who shall, within fifteen (15) days after the first publication of the notice of the passage of this resolution as delivered to the Town Clerk of the Town of Culbertson, a protest in writing against the proposed work or improvement, or against the maintenance, operation or supplying of electrical current thereto, or against the extent or creation of the lighting district to be assessed, or both, shall have the right to appear at said meeting in person or by counsel and show cause, if any there be, why said special improvement lighting district should not be created and the improvement herein mentioned should not be made, and the annual costs of maintenance, operation and supplying of electrical current to said system should not be assessed against the real property within the boundaries of said proposed special improvement lighting district.

SECTION X: The following notice of the adoption of this resolution shall be published in one issue of The Searchlight, a weekly newspaper published in the Town of Culbertson, Montana, certain notice to be so published on August 15, 1963:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on the 7 day of August, A.D. 1963, the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson, Montana, adopted a certain resolution of intention to create a special improvement lighting district for the purpose of lighting the streets within the Town Limits of Culbertson, Montana, as specifically described in the resolution of intention, reference to which is hereby made, which improvements shall include the replacement of fifty (50) incandescent old-type 100 watt open bracket street lights with 292 watt enclosed Mercury Vapor Luminaires providing from four to five times the illumination provided by the old type street lights. The estimated cost of maintenance and operation and supplying of electrical current to said system for the first year for the entire district, which maintenance, operation and cost of supplying electrical current are to be assessed by a special assessment against the property embraced within the Special Improvement Lighting District, is \$4761.13.

by counsel and show cause, any there be, why said special improvement lighting district should not be created and the improvement herein mentioned should not be made, and the annual costs of maintenance, operation and supplying of electrical current to said system should not be assessed against the real property within the boundaries of said proposed special improvement lighting district.

That the costs of maintenance, operation and supplying of electrical current to said lighting system shall be paid twenty-five per cent (25%) by the Town of Culbertson, and the balance of seventy-five per cent (75%) will be assessed to the property owners within the district, payable annually on a pro-rated basis equally according to the ratio each lot area bears to the entire area within the special improvement lighting district, exclusive of streets, avenues, alleys and public places.
