C O N T R A C T

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THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into as of the 22 day of April, 1971 by and between LARSEN CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, a partnership, Culbertson, Montana hereinafter called the "Contractor" and the TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA, hereinafter called the "Owner".

WITNESSETH, that the Contractor and the Owner for the consideration stated herein agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 - SCOPE OF WORK

The Contractor shall furnish all of the material and perform all of the work described in the specification entitled "Plans and Specifications for CULBERTSON SWIMMING POOL prepared by WEBSTER, FOSTER & WESTON, acting as, and in these contract documents entitled the "Engineer" and the Contractor shall do everything required by this agreement and the contract documents.

ARTICLE 2 - COMMENCEMENT AND COMPLETION OF WORK

The Contractor shall commence work under this contract on a date to be specified in a written order of the Owner and shall complete the work within forty-five (45) calendar days from the date of the "Notice to Proceed".

ARTICLE 3 - THE CONTRACT SUM

The Owner shall pay the Contractor for the performance of this contract according to the following schedule of approximate quantities and unit prices, the aggregate of which is estimated to be approximately \$43,792.80.

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA, DECLARING IT TO BE THE INTENTION OF SAID TOWN COUNCIL TO CREATE SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER 6 IN SAID TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXCAVATING, PAVING WITH ASPHALTIC MIX, INSTALLING CONCRETE CURB AND GUTTER, AND MISCELLANEOUS DRAINAGE ITEMS AND EXTEND AND REPAIR SANITARY SEWER AND WATER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM, IN AND UPON THE TOWN STREETS AND TO SERVE AND BENEFIT THE PROPERTY HEREINAFTER SET FORTH AND DESCRIBED AND SITUATED WITHIN THE SAID TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA; DESIGNATING THE BOUNDARIES OF SAID PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT; STATING THE GENERAL CHARACTER OF THE IMPROVEMENTS TO BE MADE THEREIN; STATING THE APPROXIMATE ESTIMATED COST THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR THE GIVING OF NOTICE AND FIXING THE TIME FOR HEARING PROTEST AGAINST THE PROPOSED WORK OR AGAINST THE PROPOSED EXTENT OR CREATION OF SAID DISTRICT TO BE ASSESSED OR BOTH.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA:

SECTION 1. That whereas public interest and convenience require, and it is deemed necessary to order and create a Special Improvement District for the purpose of excavating, paving with asphaltic mix, installing concrete curb and gutter, in and upon the town streets, the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson, Montana, does hereby declare its intention to so create a Special Improvement District, the boundaries of which and the character of the improvements to be made therein are as hereinafter set forth.

SECTION 2. That said Special Improvement District shall be known and designated as "Special Improvement District Number 6."

SECTION 3. That the boundaries of said Special Improvement District Number 6 shall be and are hereby designated and declared as follows, to-wit:

Begin at a point 20 feet West of the Northwest corner of Lot 1 of Block 8 of Cushings First Addition to the City of Culbertson, Montana; thence due South along the west alley line of said Block 8 and Block 9 of said Cushings First Addition a distance of 732 feet to the northeast corner of Outlot 1; thence at a right angle and West along the north line of Outlot 1 a distance of 145.1 feet to the northwest corner of said Outlot 1; thence southerly along the west line of Outlot 1 a distance of 213.8 feet; thence at a right angle and westerly a distance of 191 feet; thence at a right angle and southerly a distance of 185 feet to the northwest corner of Lot 9, Block 2 of Cushings Second Addition; thence westerly and along the south alley line of said Block 2 a distance of 150.6 feet to the northwest corner of Lot 15 of said Block 2, thence South along the west line of said Block 2 and Block 3 of Cushings Second Addition a distance of 525.3 feet to the southwest corner of Lot 21 of said Block 3; thence southerly at right angles to Second Street a distance of 66 feet; thence easterly at

a right angle 132 feet to the northwest corner of Lot 23 of Block 4 of Cushings Second Addition; thence southerly and along the west line of Lot 23 a distance of 160 feet to the south line of the alley in Block 4 of Cushings Second Addition; thence easterly along said south alley line a distance of 125 feet to the northeast corner of Lot 13 of Block 4 of Cushings Second Addition; thence at a right angle and southerly along the east line of said Lot 13 a distance of 180 feet more or less to the south line of Section 29; thence East along the said south line of Section 29 a distance of 670 feet more or less to a point, the said point is a point of intersection with a line parallel to, 150 feet distant from in a southerly direction of the south line of First Street; thence easterly on said line parallel to the south line of said First Street 480 feet more or less to the center of Block 12 of the Original Townsite; thence at a right angle and southerly along the center-line of the alley of said Block 12 a distance of 316 feet to the centerline of the main line track of the Burlington Northern Railway; thence at a right angle and easterly along the centerline of the said track a distance of 1370 feet more or less to a point; thence North, 140 feet distance from and parallel to the east line of Third Avenue East, a distance of 517.4 feet to the south line of First Street; thence westerly along the south line of First Street 148 feet to the east line of said Third Avenue East; thence North along the east line of said Third Avenue East a distance of 730 feet; thence at a right angle to the east 140 feet; thence 220 feet North to the south line of Block 16 of Brueggers Addition; thence East along the south line of Blocks 16, 15, 14 and 13 a distance of 1086 feet more or less to the southeast corner of lot 3 of said Block 13; thence at a right angle and North 506 feet to the northeast corner of Lot 3 of Block 12 of said Bruegger's Addition; thence at a right angle and West along the south line of Sixth Street a distance of 3552 feet more or less to the point of beginning.

all of which said lots and pieces or parcels of land are the real estate and property situated and included within the boundaries of said proposed Special Improvement District Number 6, and the town council hereby finds and determines that all of said hereinabove described lots and parcels of land, will be specifically benefited and affected by said proposed improvements;

SECTION 4. That the general character of the proposed improvements to be made in said proposed Special Improvement District Number 6 are hereby declared to be as follows:

The pavement consisting of roadway excavation, subgrade compaction, asphalt concrete base and wearing course, excess gravel for base, A.C. for hot mix, seal oil, dilute emulsion fog coat, seal aggregate, straight curb and gutter, circular curb and gutter, curb and gutter removal where the same exists, 8 inch valley



gutter, 6 inch alley driveways, 4 inch sidewalk in some areas as replacement and as is necessary to join curbs with existing sidewalk removal of some existing sidewalk when necessary, miscellaneous drainage items, adjustment of existing manholes and adjustment of valve boxes, extend and repair sanitary sewer and water distribution system. The paving above consists of curb, gutters and asphalt paving on streets within the Special Improvement District Number 6.

SECTION 5. That the approximate estimate of the cost of making and constructing said improvement to include the materials required and engineering and supervisory costs, is the sum of \$565,000.00

SECTION 6. That it is the intention of the Town Council of the said Town of Culbertson, Montana, that all costs and expenses incurred in the construction of making said improvements shall be paid by Special Improvement District Bonds with interest bearing coupons attached; such bonds shall be drawn substantially in the form as provided by law in such cases, which bonds shall be drawn against Special Improvement District Number 6, hereinafter to be ordered and created; that the entire cost and expense of said proposed improvements shall be paid by said proposed Special Improvement District and each lot and parcel of land within such district shall be assessed for that part of the whole cost which its area bears to the area of the entire district exclusive of streets, avenues, alleys and public places. All parks, streets and alleys, and land owned by the United States Government, shall be excluded from the land to be assessed. Said assessments shall be paid for in twenty annual installments with the privilege of each property owner to pay the amount of his assessment within twenty years from the time of the completion of said proposed work and improvements at any time, said installments to be spread and extended over a period of twenty years, and to bear interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent (6%) per annum from the date of their registration, interest to be paid annually on deferred payments, and said payments shall constitute a fund to be known as "Special Improvement District Number 6 Fund" and it is intended that Special Improvement District Bonds shall be issued against such fund, the denomination and maturity dates of such bonds and warrants to be fixed by resolution to be hereinafter adopted.

SECTION 7. That at any time within fifteen (15) days after the date of the publication of the notice of the passage of this resolution, any owner of property liable to be assessed for said work, may make written protest against the proposed work or against the extent or creation of the district to be assessed or both. Such protest must be in writing and be delivered to the Clerk of the Town Council not later than 5:00 o'clock P.M. of the last day within said fifteen day period, and said Clerk shall endorse thereon the date and hour of its receipt by him; and that said protests shall be heard and passed upon by the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson, Montana, at its regular meeting thereof to be held on the 8th day of September, 1971, at 8:00 o'clock P.M. of said day at the Council Chambers of said Town of Culbertson, Montana.

SECTION 8. Upon the passing of this resolution the Town Clerk is hereby directed to give notice of the passage and adoption of this resolution by publication in one issue of The Searchlight, a weekly newspaper published in said Town of Culbertson, Montana, and to post said notice in three public places in said Town of Culbertson at least fifteen (15) days prior to the 3rd day of September, 1971, which notice shall be in the form and manner as hereinafter set forth, and further, said Clerk is hereby directed to mail a copy of said notice to every person, firm or corporation, or the agent of such person, firm or corporation, having property within the proposed district at his last known address upon the same day such notice is published and posted.

SECTION 9. The form of notice to be published as herein proposed in Section 8, shall be in the following form:

That whereas public interest and convenience require, and it is deemed necessary to order and create a Special Improvement District for the purpose of excavating, paving with asphaltic mix, installing concrete curb and gutter, in and upon the town streets, the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson, Montana, does hereby declare its intention to so create a Special Improvement District, the boundaries of which are the character of the improvements to be made therein are as hereinafter set forth;

SECTION 2. That said Special Improvement District shall be known and designated as "Special Improvement District Number 7."

SECTION 3. That the boundaries of said Special Improvement District Number 7 shall be and are hereby designated and declared as follows, to-wit:

Begin at the southeast corner of Block 5 of Brueggers Addition to the City of Culbertson; thence North along the east line of block 5 and 4 a distance of 506 feet to the northeast corner of said Block 4; thence West and along the north line of Blocks 4,3,2, and 1 of Brueggers Addition a distance of 1259 feet to the centerline of Third Avenue East; thence at a right angle and North a distance of 226 feet to the north line of Eighth Street; thence at a right angle and West a distance of 696 feet more or less to the east line of First Avenue East; thence at a right angle and South along the east line of said First Avenue East a distance of 732 feet to the north line of Sixth Street; thence at a right angle and East and along the north line of Sixth Street a distance of 1955 feet more or less to the point of beginning.



all of which said lots and pieces or parcels of land are the real estate and property situated and included within the boundaries of said proposed Special Improvement District Number 7, and the town council hereby finds and determined that all of said hereinabove described lots and parcels of land, will be specifically benefited and affected by said proposed improvements.

SECTION 4. That the general character of the proposed improvements to be made in said proposed Special Improvement District Number 7 are hereby declared to be as follows:

The pavement consisting of roadway excavation, subgrade compaction, asphalt concrete base and wearing course, excess gravel for base, A.C. for hot mix, seal oil, dilute emulsion fog coat, seal aggregate, straight curb and gutter, circular curb and gutter, curb and gutter removal where the same exists, 8 inch valley gutter, 6 inch alley driveways, 4 inch sidewalk in some areas as replacement and as is necessary to join curbs with existing sidewalk removal of some existing sidewalk when necessary, miscellaneous drainage items, adjustment of existing manholes and adjustment of valve boxes, extend and repair sanitary sewer and water distribution system. The paving above consists of curb gutters and asphalt paving on streets within the Special Improvement District Number 7.

SECTION 5. That the approximate estimate of the cost of making and constructing said improvement to include the materials required and engineering and supervisory costs, is the sum of \$115,000.00.

SECTION 6. That it is the intention of the Town Council of the said Town of Culbertson, Montana, that all costs and expenses incurred in the construction of making said improvements shall be paid by Special Improvement District Bonds with interest bearing coupons attached; such bonds shall be drawn substantially in the form as provided by law in such cases, which bonds shall be drawn against Special Improvement District Number 7, hereinafter to be ordered and created; that the entire cost and expense of said proposed improvements shall be paid by said proposed Special Improvement District and each lot and parcel of land within such district shall be assessed for that part of the whole cost which its area bears to the area of the entire district exclusive of streets, avenues, alleys and public places. All parks, streets and alleys, and land owned by the United States Government, shall be excluded from the land to be assessed. Said assessments shall be paid for in twenty annual installments with the privilege of each property owner to pay the amount of his assessment within twenty years from the time of the completion of said proposed work and improvements at any time, said installments to be spread and extended over a period of twenty years, and to bear interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent (6%) per annum from the date of their registration, interest to be paid annually on deferred payments, and said payments shall constitute a fund to be known as "Special Improvement District Number 7 Fund" and it is intended that Special



Improvement District Bonds shall be issued against such fund, the denomination and maturity dates of such bonds and warrants to be fixed by resolution to be hereinafter adopted.

SECTION 7. That at any time within fifteen (15) days after the date of the publication of the notice of the passage of this resolution, any owner of property liable to be assessed for said work, may make written protest against the proposed work or against the extent or creation of the district to be assessed or both. Such protest must be in writing and be delivered to the Clerk of the Town Council not later than 5:00 o'clock P.M. of the last day within said fifteen day period, and said Clerk shall endorse thereon the date and hour of its receipt by him; and that said protests shall be heard and passed upon by the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson, Montana, at its regular meeting thereof to be held on the 8th day of September, 1971, at 8:00 o'clock P.M. of said day at the Council Chambers of said Town of Culbertson, Montana.

SECTION 8. Upon the passing of this resolution the Town Clerk is hereby directed to give notice of the passage and adoption of this resolution by publication in one issue of The Searchlight, a weekly newspaper published in said Town of Culbertson, Montana, and to post said notice in three public places in said Town of Culbertson at least fifteen (15) days prior to the 3rd day of September, 1971, which notice shall be in the form and manner as hereinafter set forth, and further, said Clerk is hereby directed to mail a copy of said notice to every person, firm or corporation, or the agent of such person, firm or corporation, having property within the proposed district at his last known address upon the same day such notice is published and posted.

SECTION 9. The form of notice to be published as herein proposed in Section 8, shall be in the following form:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that on the 9th day of August, 1971, the Town Council of the Town of Culbertson, Montana, passed and adopted a Resolution of Intention to Create a Special Improvement District Number 7. and that said resolution is Resolution Number 148. For a detailed description of the boundaries of said district, refer to the resolution on file in the office of the Town Clerk, Culbertson, Montana.
