

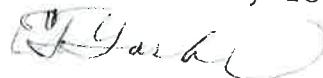

CONTRACT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 7th day of February, 1972, by and between the Town of Culbertson, Montana, a municipal corporation of the State of Montana hereinafter referred to as the Owner, party of the first part, and WEBSTER, FOSTER & WESTON, Consulting Engineers, a Professional Corporation of Williston, North Dakota, hereinafter called the Engineer, party of the second part.

WITNESSETH AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, the Owner proposes to construct certain improvements in SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 6 within the Town of Culbertson; and

WHEREAS, THE Owner desires to retain the professional services of an Engineer for the purpose of providing necessary preliminary investigations, surveys, reports, designs, plans, specifications; construction contract documents, inspection, etc; and

WHEREAS, the Engineer has heretofore agreed to provide said Engineering services for the consideration and on the terms hereinafter specifically provided; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of both parties that said agreement be reduced to written form; and

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter contained, it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto, as follows:

1. The Engineer shall proceed with due diligence to make an investigation of the streets whereon the street improvements are proposed and to make such surveys and measurements as required to furnish the Owner with recommendations for the proposed street improvements together with estimates of construction costs involved; the Engineer shall also prepare plans and specifications for the construction of such street improvements as said Owner decides to construct; shall perform all the usual, customary and necessary engineering as required in designing and proper construction of said improvements, shall prepare plans and specifications sufficient and suitable for use by Contractors, Mechanics and Builders in the actual construction of said improvements; shall prepare all notices to contractors, advertisements, instructions to bidders, proposal blanks, copies of plans and specifications, forms for contracts, forms for bond, and properly attend to all details in order that competitive bids for labor and materials incidental to construction of said improvements can be secured to the best possible advantage of said Owner; shall participate in necessary conferences with the Owner; shall assist the Owner in receiving, tabulating and evaluation of proposals and advise the Owner in the award of construction contracts; the Engineer shall also inspect all materials furnished for use, and used in such construction and see that no improper or unsuitable materials are used; and he shall inspect during the time of actual construction to see that all terms of the construction contracts and

all parts of the plans and specifications are complied with by the contractors and sub-contractors, it being intended that the Engineer shall inspect the construction to such extent as to insure that the work is being built in accordance with the plans and specifications and that the construction contractors comply with the terms of their contracts; in accomplishing such inspection, he shall have on the project during all actual construction, a competent inspector, who shall be the representative of the Engineer, and in addition, an experienced Engineer who is familiar with the project shall make at least one visit per calendar week, it being understood that the Engineer shall not be required to furnish any inspection or visits to the work during the periods when work may be suspended due to weather or other reasons for suspension of work. The Engineer shall keep the Owner informed as to the progress of the work, and shall prepare periodic and final estimates for approval by the Owner in connection with payments due to the construction contractor. The Engineer will not, however, guarantee the performance by any contractor.

2. For and in consideration of the Engineer's rendering all of the services called for under this contract, the Owner shall pay the Engineer a sum equivalent to ten and one-half percent (10½%) of the total actual construction contract price paid to the contractor for all street surfacing, portland cement concrete curb and gutter, valley gutter, driveways and other portland cement items. Payment under this paragraph to be made in the following manner, to-wit:

(a) A sum equivalent to five and one-half percent (5½%) of the estimated cost of proposed construction to be paid upon completion of the construction plans and specifications and the acceptance and approval thereof by the Owner.

(b) The balance in monthly installments during construction, said installments to be in an amount equivalent to five percent (5%) of the amount paid by the Owner on construction contract price for construction work performed by the contractors in constructing street surfacing, curb and gutter, valley gutters, driveways, and other portland cement items during the previous month.

(c) When the total actual construction cost is determined, the Engineer shall prepare and present to the Owner, an itemized statement showing amounts due to the Engineer based upon actual construction costs and the amount paid to the Engineer based upon estimated costs under paragraph (a) above and under paragraph (b) above and such additional payment due the Engineer or credit allowed the Owner because of the estimation of costs under paragraph (a) shall be included as a part of the final payment due the Engineer on completion of all work provided for herein.

It is further understood that the sum of five and one-half percent (5½%) of the estimated cost of the proposed project which shall become due and payable upon acceptance by the Owner of the plans and specifications, shall constitute full and complete payment by the Owner to the Engineer until such time as a contract for the construction of the project has been entered into by the Owner; whenever such a contract is entered into on the basis of the plans and specifications furnished by the Engineer, the full provisions of this agreement shall become operative.

Under the provisions of this agreement, the Engineer will not be required to bear the cost of the following items:

- (a) Test drilling or other subsurface exploration.
- (b) Soil tests and soil sampling, except that the Engineer will bear all expense of field density tests and mechanical analysis required at the job sites during construction.
- (c) Laboratory tests of concrete, concrete aggregate or other material.
- (d) Mill and shop inspection of materials and equipment.
- (e) Any other items which are not generally considered to be the responsibility of the Engineer on projects of a similar nature.

It is mutually agreed that the Engineering fee shall apply only to the construction staking and inspection done prior to completion date as specified in the construction contract, or before the number of calendar days specified for completion of the project has been exceeded. The Owner agrees to pay the Consulting Engineer actual engineering expenses which shall consist of the Engineer's actual payroll plus 35%, plus mileage of twelve cents per mile and sustenance, for staking and inspection required after the specified completion date.

The Owner shall withhold such monies from the contractor's final estimate as liquidated damages to pay the Engineer for staking and inspection services performed after the specified completion date.

It is further understood and agreed that cost of construction as herein referred to shall be construed to mean actual construction cost to the Owner and shall not include legal, engineering or administrative costs.

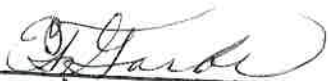

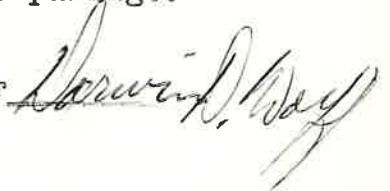
