

Council met in regular session with all members present. Minutes of last meetings were read and approved. The clerk informed the council that over 50% of property owners had filed a petition asking that consideration be given to pave all property North of highway 2. It was moved by Allen Larsen and seconded by Arlie Larsen to proceed with this request all council men voting in favor of same. A bid of \$12,660.00 for Garabge contract was received by the Council from William Krueger and was accepted by the council. The clerk explained to the Council that in order to meet the extra cost of the contract it would be necessary to raise garbage rates 50%. However to conform with the new accounting method it would be necessary to reduce sewer rates \$1.25 a month and increase gabage \$1.75 a month, attorney was instructed to draw up a resolution for same. A public meeting was scheduled for Jan. 9th 8 PM. prairie room at bank to explain to the people of Culbertson a grant the council was negotiating with HUB to purchase fire equipment Etc. but the public was to be informed and to get their approval or to ask for any other eligable project. Mrs Peterson stated that the swimmng pool ^{personnel} had contacted her and would like to hired for 1975, council informed her to have them present a written application.
