A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA, ANNEXING AND TO EXTEND ITS BOUNDARIES TO INCLUDE PARCEL OF LAND BE-LOW DESCRIBED KNOWN AS THE ROOSEVELT MEMORIAL HOSPITAL TRACT.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA:

ORDINANCE NO. 139

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE DRILLING FOR AND PRODUCTION OF OIL AND GAS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON, MONTANA:

Section 1: The Town Council of the Town of Culbertson, Montana, makes these findings:

That there has been substantial oil and gas drilling activity in the nearby areas and that the technology of the drilling of oil and gas wells has advanced to a state where it is no longer necessary to drill directly over oil and gas in place.

Section 2: Therefore, it is ordained that the drilling for and production of oil and gas within the corporate limits of the Town of Culbertson is unlawful and is prohibited.

Section 3: The Town Attorney of the Town of Culbertson. Montana is empowered to enforce this ordinance by the use of injunction or other legal remedy.
