K Mr. and Mrs. Willie Krueger came to council asking for a copy of there first contract and an affidavid stating the number of years they served in garbage collection.

After a lot of discussion on the request for water to Continental Grain mainly for fire protection— it was the consensus of the council to inform them of our water situtation.
