Motion made by Bertino to check into a Green River Ordinance for Culbertson. Second by Miller. Voting in favor: Bertino, Miller. Opposed: Plummer, Reitz. Tie Break: Baldwin voted in favor. Motion carried.

Ambulance volunteers to report back to the council on their need for a Post Office Box.

Motion made by Reitz to call in SID #11 Bonds Nos. 34 thru 44 and SID #6 Bonds Nos. 164 thru 188. Second by Bertino. Voting in favor: Reitz, Miller, Bertino, Plummer.

Clerk to check into the cost of piano tuning for the senior citizens piano.

The council agreed to the clerk's attendance at the Montana Institute for Municipal Clerks to be held in Bozeman March 16th thru the 20th.

Clerk to send out follow-up letters to the three offenders of the garbage rack ordinance with deadline for compliance on Jan. 15.

Audit Conference. Prior to the meeting, an exit conference was held with state auditor, Gary Romero.

It will be another month before GA Industries will install the new valves. They have to okay the electrical work that is involved first.

Ambulance. Dave Dean was present representing the ambulance crew. It was decided that all financial business will be channeled through the Town Office. Dave reported on the frequency of ambulance runs made in previous years.

Cemetery. Bill Krall presented to the council rules and regulations dealing with excavation and flowers at the Hillside Cemetery. Copies will be on file in the Town Office and also sent to the area funeral directors.

Piano Tuning. A motion was made by Miller to tune the piano in the Senior Citizens Hall. Seconded by Reitz. Those voting in favor: Miller, Reitz, Bertino. Voting against: None. Absent and not voting: Plummer. Motion carried. Clerk to contact Custom Piano Service in Williston where a \$40 bid was received.

Two-way radios. Clerk to send a letter of request to Sun Production in Texas for a base station and mobile radio. State why we want them and what they will be used for.

HKM Sliding Scale. Clerk to contact HKM about a sliding scale for 15.40 assessment charge which was supposed to take place 2 years after implementation. Quail was engineer in charge of this.

Green River Ordinance. Mayor Baldwin to review Williston's Green River Ordinance and report his findings to the Council.

School Water Charges. Clerk presented water charges and useage for the School's C-C complex for the past 4 years. Charges averaged \$212/year and useage 302,650 gallons/year.

March 2, 1987. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session with the following present: Dave Plummer, Larry Reitz, Gordon Miller, James Baldwin, Greg Hennessy, and DeAnne Weeks. The minutes of February 2 were read and approved.

Police Reserve. Lavern Schledewitz was present to report on the channeling of police reserve training funds from the Town to the County. This money is only available for police training and will be used in the Sheriff's Department to help fund schooling and instruction.

Centennial Float. Harold Forbregd of the Centennial Parade Committee requested a float entry from the Town. No action was taken.

Centennial Entertainment. Nick Nichols from the Centennial Entertainment Committee was also present seeking information about ordinances regulating beer sales and possible beer gardens during the celebration. If all of the State standards are met, the Town has no problem with a beer garden. However, the Town does have an open container ordinance that could be enforced outside the approved gardens.

Landfill Fence Bids. Bid requirements for the fence at the new dump site were discussed. All bids must be on a bid sheet form which will be available at the Town Hall. Advertisement for accepting of bids to be placed in the paper.

Garbage Rates. A motion was made by Miller to put in to effect an emergency ordinance to correct the continual deficit in the garbage fund by adjusting garbage rates to a break even point. Rate increases as amended are as follows: 1.00/month for residents and 2.00/month for commercial accounts. These rates are effective immediately. Seconded by Plummer. All voted in favor. Motion carried. Compensation for additional mileage to the new landfill site was also discussed.

Tree Removal. Ron Schuetze failed to respond to the council's request to attend the council meeting. Reitz made a motion to have Doug remove the tree that is pushing up the curb next to Schuetze's trailer. Plummer seconded. All in favor. Motion carried.

GJV's No. 19 thru 22 were signed and approved.

Insurance. Montana League of Cities and Towns' exclusion amendment, subsection C, Exclusions, Item #8, was reviewed and approved.

Clerk's Institute. Pat Rowe will fill in half days the week of March 16-20 for DeAnne while she attends the Clerks Institute in Bozeman.

Election. Declarations and petitions for nomination in the upcoming municipal election are on hand in the clerk's office. The last day for filing these in the Clerk and Recorder's Office is July 2.

Landfill Equipment. Landfill equipment was discussed again. More information is desired on a used 4-wheel drive loader with sheep's foot and clam bucket or a pull-type sheep's foot with a track-type tractor to pull it with a clam bucket and a solid rubber tire 4-wheel drive front end loader.

Maude Schuetze Day. A motion was made by Reitz to dedicate a day in April to Maude Schuetze for all she has put back into our community through her estate. Seconded by Miller. All in favor. Motion carried.

Beautification Project. Illa Mae Forbregd suggested that the Town promote a beautification program in the community for the Centennial Celebration. Youth organizations could be helpful with clean-up projects.

Original Street Signs. Council okayed Carol Hllgrimson's request to cover the present street signs with names of the original streets during the Centennial.

GJV No. 23 was approved and signed.

Centennial Water Reconnection. Water in vacant houses may be turned on during the Centennial for a 25.00 reconnection fee, minimum charges based on utilities used, and the monthly 15.40. If water is open longer than 30 days, accrued 15.40's must be paid in full to continue services.

Ambulance Collections. Council approved sending overdue ambulance bills to the Sidney Credit Bureau for collection.

Fireman's Fund Relief. The Culbertson Fireman's Fund Relief Association fiscal year operating report was presented to the Council and approved.

Office Help. Permission was granted to hire Pat Rowe to help with the CDBG low & moderate income verification letters.

May 4, 1987. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session with the following present: Gordon Miller, Larry Reitz, Dave Plummer, Bart Bertino, James Baldwin, and DeAnne Weeks. The minutes from April 6 were read and approved.

Cleaning Contract. The Council agreed to increase Bev's cleaning contract for the summer months when the park facilities are open. June will be contracted at \$110 and May, July, & August, \$70 for each month.

Stagecoach. Nancy Hjelm of the Stagecoach Inn was present requesting permission to establish a beer garden in her parking lot during the Centennial. The Council agreed to this as long as state laws are met.

Firemen's Clothing. Lloyd Aspenlieder of the Culbertson Volunteer Fire Department presented a proposal to the council for the purchase of twenty-three pair of Fire Fighter Bib Pants with liners and twenty-three pair of knee high boots, all N.F.P.A. approved. They requested that the Town pay for half, \$2817.50, out of the fire department's budget. The Council agreed to this proposal.

Landfill Fence Bid. The bid for the landfill perimeter fence was awarded to Arlie Larsen with a bid of \$4679. This figure does not include the gate, which will be negotiated at a later date.

Lions Club. Bruce Houle of the Culbertson Lions Club offered assistance to the Town from the Lions in the upgrading and maintenance of the Bicentennial Park. They would like to help in an effort to make the park a more inviting stopping place.

Sale of Desks. The Council agreed to advertise the old law enforcement writing desks. These to be taken on bids and sold to the highest bidder if acceptable.

Centennial Committee Appointment. A motion was made by Reitz to appoint Mike Weeks to the Culbertson Centennial Committee for the Town's Centennial Celebration in June of 1987. Second by Plummer. All in favor. Motion carried.

Pool Personnel. Hiring of personnel for the swimming pool was discussed and acted upon. Hired as manager was Alice Larsen at 5.00/hr. and assistant manager Maureen McPhail at 4.50/hr. Lifeguards for this season will be Darcy Anderson, Mike Nickoloff, Daryl Beck, Teresia Lyseng, Kari Skedsvold, Tom Rumsey, and Ron Reitz. Lifeguards will be paid 4.50/hr. and basket persons 3.50/hr. The opening date has tentatively been set for May 23 and the Closing date September 7. Season tickets will remain the same as last year at \$20 for an individual and \$45 for a family.

Summer Help. The Council hired Dean Rasmussen for summer maintenance help at 5.00/ contracted hour.

Outdoor Activity. A motion was made by Miller to award the summer baseball program \$260 from the Outdoor Activity Fund.

Fogger. The Council agreed to try and budget for a new mosquito fogger in the 1987-88 budget.

Sheriff's Contract. The proposed contract between the Town of Culbertson and the County was tabled. One item that the Council wishes to include is parolling of the new landfill road.

Building Permits. Building permits were granted to Steve Baldwin, Debbie Schledewitz, and Jeri Taberna. Permission was also granted to Ronald Pennell to remove his mother's house.

Clerk Vacation. The Council agreed to the Clerk taking a week's vacation May 11th thru 15th. They also approved her attending a Bars Workshop in Wolf Point on May 18.

GJV's 24 and 25 were approved and signed.

Triangle Electric. Triangle Electric submitted a bill for 389.33 to the Town for electrical work associated with the Solenoid valves beyond what was quoted (\$260). Clerk to call HKM for assistance.

August 3, 1987. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session. Those present: Edwin Bertino, Dave Plummer, Larry Reitz, Gordon Miller, James Baldwin, Greg Hennessy, and DeAnne Weeks. The minutes of July 6 were read and approved.

Landfill Equipment. Gery Haag of Midwest Machinery and Myron Heupel of Western Plains Machinery were both present. Further discussions were held on bids submitted by both at the July Council Meeting. John Deere's warranty is 6 months on everything down to the light bulbs and 18 additional months on the power train. Western's warranty is 1 year on everything and 1 additional year on the power train. Both companies stated that they would furnish a temporary replacement should our purchased machine be on down time. John Deere's financing plan could be set up over 7 years with interest of 7% on the declining balance. Western's financing could also be set up over 7 years with interest of 7.5% on the declining balance.

Discussion was had of the emergency nature of the purchase of the landfill machine because of the threatened fines by the State if not covered daily and requiring the old landfill to be closed. Resolution was made by plummer to declare the purchase of the loader an emergency in order to meet the State's mandated deadline. Second by Reitz. Those voting in favor: Plummer, Reitz, Bertino and Miller. Opposed: None. Absent and not voting: None. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Plummer to accept the bid from Midwest Machinery Co. as the lowest responsible bid on a new John Deere 555B crawler/loader equipped with all specifications from the Town of Culbertson's original bid sheet for \$55,650, a down payment of \$10,000, the balance spread over 6 years, interest rate of 7%, and expected delivery date in 60 days. Acceptance of Midwest Machinery's bid is contingent on the understanding that if the Town of Culbertson chooses not to budget for the machine in any fiscal year, Midwest will pick up the machine and the Town of Culbertson can walk away cost free and that local service will be available through Culbertson Implement. This understanding will be fully stated in the financial contract which will be signed upon delivery of the machine to the Town of Culbertson. Second by Reitz. Those voting in favor: Bertino, Plummer, Reitz, Miller. Those opposed: None. Absent and not voting: None. Motion carried.

Bertino moved to reconsider previous motion on financing of the John Deere 555B over a 7 year period rather than a 6 year period as first proposed. Second by Miller. Those voting in favor: Bertino, Miller. Those Opposed: Plummer, Reitz. Absent and not voting: None. Mayor Baldwin broke the tie by voting in favor. Motion amended to read financing of the 555B over a 7 year period. Budgeted amount for fiscal year 1987-1988 for landfill equipment is \$83,022.40.

Resolution Nonpartisan Elections. Resolution <sup>de</sup>may by Reitz (No. 243) to authorize non-partisan municipal elections pursuant to HB 452 in order to continue the tradition of nonpartisan municipal elections in the Town of Culbertson. Second by Miller. All in favor. Motion carried.

Pool Speed Limit. 15 mph speed signs to ordered and placed on the road to and from the swimming pool.

Opening & Covering of Landfill Contract. The Council offered Lynn Labatte a contract of \$486/month to open the new landfill, cover the refuse, and maintain the equipment. Contract is base on \$10/hr. to bury X 6 hours/week (4 weeks), \$4/hr. to man the gate X 8 hours/day (8 months) - 4 hours/day (4 months) and \$33/month for maintenance. This contract will be on a trial basis for 90 days upon opening of the new landfill.

Trailer Ordinance. Motion made by Miller to create Ordinance No. 156 to amend Ordinance No. 146 to read "All trailers shall be a minimum of 700 sq. ft." rather than, "All trailers shall be a minimum of 14 feet in width and of 60 feet in length . Second by Plummer. All in favor. Motion carried.

Library Budget. Motion made by Bertino to pass Rsolution No. 244 increasing the Library fund budget for fiscal year 1986-87 by \$37.40. Second by Reitz. All in favor. Motion carried.

Mosquito Fogger. Motion made by Miller to go ahead and purchase the dura-fog mosquito fogger from Share Corporation for \$2452.25 as quoted and 55 gallons of spray for \$1372.25. Freight not included in these prices. Second by Bertino. All in favor. Motion carried.

Building Permits. Building permits granted to Henry Lannen, Chris Boysun, Hermen Jensen, and the American Legion and Auxiliary.

GJV's 30 and 31 approved and signed.

Insurance. Council agreed to continue with our insurance policies through Seitz Insurance.

Final Budget Meeting. The Council will meet to fix the final budget on August 6 at 7p.m.

Second by Reitz. All in favor: Miller, Reitz, Plummer. Those opposed: None. Absent and not voting: Bertino. Motion carried.

Arrangements were made to have the clerk construct two signs for the new landfill. These to be completed by October 3. Meeting adjourned at 10:20 p.m.

October 5, 1987. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session. Those present: Dave Plummer, Edwin Bertino, Larry Reitz, James Baldwin, DeAnne Weeks & Greg Hennessy. Landfill Pit. Laverne Schledewitz reported back on an approximate cost for digging a pit for our landfill. He figured on .23/yard for a 10,000 yard pit for a total cost of \$2300.

GJV's 32, 33, 36, & 37 were approved and signed.

Weed District. Council decided against giving the Weed District a break in their sewer rate as requested. All commercials will have a base rate of 2.50 plus .07 for every 100 gallons of water used.

Hook Up Fee. Any existing water line that has not been paying a monthly water bill must pay all past due 15.40's, a 25.00 reconnection fee, and a 50.00 deposit before service can be restored. New Hook ups that have no existing line must pay \$360.00 a 25.00 reconnection, a \$50.00 deposit, and the 15.40 assessments commence at that time. The 360.00 hook up fee will be reviewed and adjusted January of every year.

Audit Findings. Clerk to create an inventory sheet to record all assets owned and purchased by the Town. This inventory to be updated each year.

Liquor License. Bertino made a motion to amend ordinance 5:10:04 dealing with liquor licenses to read: "All licenses issued in any year shall expire on December 31", rather than expiring on June 30. December 7, 1987. The Culbertson Town Council met in regular session with the following present: Edwin Bertino, Dave Plummer, Larry Reitz, Gordon Miller, James Baldwin, Greg Hennessy, and DeAnne Weeks. Minutes of November 2 were read and approved.

Sheriff's Phone. Sheriff Grainger was present to discuss deletion of the 6654 Sheriff's number that rings into Wolf Point with no long distance charges to the caller. Due to the high cost of maintaining this line (\$340/mo.) and low useage (36 calls/yr.) it was agreed to delete this line and make available a 1-800 number already installed at the county level. The new number is 1-800-228-5484 and if that is busy people may call 1-653-1061, which is a toll call.

Tarp Law. Discussion was had about enforcement of the tarp or contain law. Littering tickets may be issued only if littering is actually witnessed by an officer or citizen who has submitted a signed complaint. The council agreed to deny admittance to the landfill by anyone whose load is not tarped or contained.

Burn Pit. A burn pit will be constructed at the landfill for all untreated wood. The burn pit will be burned periodically after obtaining a burn permit from the county sanitarian.

Landfill Monitor Wells. According to the Department of Health and Environmental Sciences, the monitoring wells at the landfill must be checked for groundwater monthly for a period of one year and reports sent to the Solid & Hazardous Waste Bureau. Larry Reitz to contact Dick Iverson for help in this process.

Landfill Fuel Tank. Miller made a motion to purchase a used fuel tank for the landfill from Bertino for \$100. Second by Reitz. All in favor. Motion carried. Town shall alternate businesses for filling of the tank. Clerk to create a check list of Gandrud Oil, Miller Oil, & Anderson Oil.

GJV's 33A, 40, 41, 42, & 43 were approved and signed.

Demolition Permit. Motion was made by Plummer to draft an ordinance for solid waste landfill fees for hauling demolished buildings to the landfill based on square feet. Burned structures to be prorated on the portion not destroyed by fire. Second by Miller. All in favor. Motion carried.

Street Light Request. Motion made by Plummer not to install a street light in the alley behind the new Legion Hall as requested. Second by Miller. All in favor. Request denied.

Building Permits. No water will be turned on until a building permit is approved and signed by three councilmen, all back 15.40's paid, and \$25 turn on fee paid.
