The proposed 2007 Town of Culbertson Subdivision Regulations are prepared to comply with the 2007 Montana Subdivision and Platting Act.

The Industrial Park Sub Division has to follow the Town of Culbertson Sub Division Regulations once adopted.

Thw town council submitted a request to the county commissioners to approve a jurisdictional area that would follow the watershed surrounding Culbertson. The town council and Planner Marcy Hamburg will set—up a meeting with the county commissioners prior to the Feb. 4, 2008 town council meeting to discuss the jurisdictional area.

Marcy tried to clear up any confusion regarding the jurisdictional area and annexation.

Old Culbertson Community Development Corp. Guests: Planner Marcy Hamburg, Tom Hansen, Clint Jacobs, Brad Raab, Ken Forbregd and Deputy Tim Lingle.

W. Bruce Houle made a motion to approve the agenda with the additions of approach permit for the north end of Culbertson Industrial Park Subdivision. Bernie W. Finnicum seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Paul S. Finnicum made a motion to approve the February 4, 2008 minutes and January 31, 2008 Treasurers Report. W. Bruce Houle seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Matt Golick, Mayor of Wolf Point, was killed in an accident. Town will send condolences to his family.

Zoning/Ordinance Permit. A Zoning/Ordinance Permit for Tom and Nancy Hansen was approved and signed.

<u>Lazy Bell Homestead.</u> Brad Raab said he is interested in purchasing lots in Lazy Bell Homestead. He plans to put a home with a crawl space under it.

Lazy Bell Homestead was platted as a mobile home court. If the lots are going to be sold for residential homes then the water and sewer main need to be extended.

Planner-Marcy Hamburg explained a boundary line relocation. Marcy will check with the clerk and recorder to see how the Lazy Bell Homestead plat was recorded and if there are any covenants etc. on the property.

<u>Cable TV.</u> Ken Forbregd talked to Mark Miller second in charge for KLiP Interactive. KLiP is not going to do anything more for our system. Culbertson has 120 subscribers. KLiP will maintain what we have.

They will not invest \$1100. for WGN. We do not have Fox News. Ken called Nemont and is on their agenda for March. Nemont appears to be interested in bundling telephone, television and computer. They are reluctant to invest in fiber optic and land lines because technology is changing so rapidly.

The Local Access Channel 15 is only available to cable users. Ken talked about Low Power Television Service for Channel 15. Need to apply through FCC for this.

Paul S. Finnicum made a motion to pursue Low Power Television service for the Town of Culbertson application to FCC to handle channel 15. W.Bruce Houle seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Ken said Direct TV will do whole communities with a franchise.

<u>Sheriff Dept.</u> Town has the old sheriff pick-up now. The new sheriff pick-up does not have plates and insurance yet.

<u>Industrial Park Subdivision.</u> Marcy said the Industrial Park Sub Division will be a minor (5 lots or less) not a major sub division.

Zoning has to be mentioned in the Growth Policy. We need a Planning Board to hold the Public Hearings on the Growth Policy.

The jurisdictional area needs to be adopted by both the town and the county governing bodies. Under Montana statute, planning boards are the only entities authorized to prepare growth policies. Local governments are required to have an adopted growth policy for the jurisdiction, and that the zoning regulations be made in accordance with the growth policy.

Marcy's recommendation is to pursue a city/county planning board. Council will need to schedule another meeting with the county commissioners and county planner.

Paul S. Finnicum made a motion to submit another request to the county commissioners and explain the council's approach more clearly. W. Bruce Houle seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Paul S. Finnicum will write the letter to the commissioners and have Marcy look it over.

Marcy's goal is to get the Industrial Park Sub Division done and ready for council approval at the April 7 meeting, then submit to DEQ.

The Department of Environmental Quality Application is extensive. Council wanted to know if County Sanitarian Ron Smith would help with the DEQ application or if town should contact Travis West to complete the application. Marcy said Travis West would probably charge around \$ 2500.

<u>Dry Prairie Rural Water.</u> Clint Jacobs reviewed the letter from Tonka Equipment Co. after their inspection of the Culbertson Water Treatment Plant. Tonka Equipment Co. observations, problems observed and recommendations were noted.

Clint presented a request for approval to amend the water Buy Sell Agreement between the Town of Culbertson and Dry Prairie. The current Agreement is now stated at "up to 400,000 gallons per day." The request is to amend the agreement to "up to 700,000 gallons per day" an increase of 300,000 gallons.

Paul S. Finnicum made a motion to approve the Second Amendment To Agreement dated May 6, 2002 Town of Culbertson - Dry Prairie Rural Water Authority, with the addition of language for a third filter train and all necessary equipment for the upgrade. W. Bruce Houle seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Clint drafted a letter to Mr. Marc Golz, P.E., SWSRF Program, Montana Dept. of Environmental Quality to request Montana DEQ approval of the action by the Town of Culbertson to amend its water supply agreement wit DPRWA. Paul S. Finnicum made a motion to send the letter to DEQ. Dallas Dehner seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

<u>Multi-Use/Library Facility.</u> The pre-construction conference was 2-26-08. The bonding agency has asked that attorney Hennessy draft a lifetime lease for the library for the duration of the bonds or as long as the library is in existence, whichever is greater. They ask that we list the building as a condominium would be with various rights, obligations, insurance-property & liability responsibilities.

<u>Airport CIP 2006-2011</u>. The airport board may choose to wait one more year and then they can widen the runway and put a new surface on.

<u>Theodore Roosevelt Expressway.</u> Town received a response from the Montana Dept. of Transportation concerning 4 lanes from the intersection of US 2 & Mt. 16 to the North Dakota Border. The town council supported option #1 with details for sidewalks, storm drain system and modifying 4 lanes to 2-lanes.

The MDT will not be able to consider the request to modify 4-lanes to 2-lanes for the 3 blocks east of the intersection of US 2 & MT. 16, because it conflicts with the purpose and need for the project. The town can counter this response letter when they hold their next public meeting.

The Theodore Roosevelt Expressway has total secured pledges and payment to date \$359,000. There is a meeting in Glasgow on Tuesday, March 25th. Paul S. Finnicum made a motion to approve mileage and meal to attend the meeting. Dallas Dehner seconded the motion. All voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED.

Basin Project. The town will try to help Basin electric to house the workers by putting together a list.

- FFA Bat Houses. Chase Buxbaum and Johnny Ruffatto were representing the FFA on a community service project. They have bat houses and would like to place them at the pool park and Bruegger-Centennial Park. Paul S. <u>Industrial Park Sub Division.</u> Marcy Hamburg, Planner, submitted the Minor Sub Division Application Staff Report Summary. The Reviewer recommends **conditional approval** of this subdivision application and should be subject to the following condition(s):

- 1. The subdivision is to be reviewed by the Dept. of Environmental Quality, (DEQ) approval for sewer and water is to be sought. The Roosevelt County Sanitarian should be contacted for further instructions and assistance in meeting the DEQ requirements. A copy of the DEQ approval will need to be filed along with the approved surveyed plat.
- 2. For recording purposes a certificate of ownership by a title abstractor showing the names of the owners of record of the land to be subdivided, the names of lien holders or claimants of record against the land, and to ensure any existing easement identified must be submitted. If there is a lien holder or claimant of record against the land, written consent is needed by the lien holder or claimant.
- 3. The plat indicates the Town of Culbertson as landowner and is required to sign the plat. The title abstract will show the official names of the landowner(s). If the names are different than shown on the plat, the plat will have to be corrected before the plat can be filed.

Dallas Dehner made a motion for conditional approval of the minor subdivision application subject to the conditions listed per Reviewer recommendation. W. Bruce Houle seconded the motion. All present voted in favor of the motion. MOTION CARRIED. There will be a mylar for final plat approval at a later date.

A guideline for development in the Industrial Park Subdivision was discussed. Development must require a building, create jobs in town and increase the local tax base. Total estimated for his services is \$4670.00. This does not include DEQ Application fee \$850.00 or any backhoe fees. Travis will be in Culbertson the week of April 21st and submit the application by the end of April. DEQ then has 60 days to review the application.

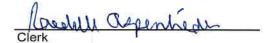
