AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON INTO WARDS FOR ELECTION AND OTHER PURPOSES, AND ESTABLISHING THE BOUNDARIES THEREOF."

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CULBERTSON:

Section 1: The territory embraced within the limits of Town of Culbertson, in Valley County, Montana, shall be and the same is hereby devided into two wards, bounded and described as hereinafter set forth.

Section 2: All that territory within the corporate limit of said Town of Culbertson west of the line commencing at a point four feet wouth of the south boundary of the Great Northern Right of Way which said is directly south of the center of Broadway Street, thence extending northerly along the center of said street Broadway to the intersection thereof with the center of Franklin Avenue, thence along the center of said Franklin Avenue in a westerly direction to the center of Patch Street, thence north along the center of said Patch Street to the north boundary of the corporate limits of the Town of Culbertson, shall be embraced in and compose Ward Number One.

Section 3: All that territory within the corporate limits of said Town of Culbertson lying east of the said line described in the preceding section shall be embraced in and compose Ward Number Two.

AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO THE TAXATION OF DOGS.  
BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Town of Culbertson.

Sec. 1. The owner of every male and female dog within the limits of the town of Culbertson is hereby required to register said animal with the town marshall on or before the first day of May of each year, and provide such animal with a collar on which shall be placed a tag showing the registered number of such animal. No such register shall be made and have effect for a longer term than one year. Every male or female dog running in the streets of said town without such collar and tag or if vicious or dangerous dog running at large in the Town of Culbertson without being muzzled shall be considered and hereby is declared to be a public nuisance and it is hereby made the duty of the town marshall of said town to abate such nuisance.

Sec. 2. The town marshall shall keep a registry showing all dogs registered by him, a description thereof, the owner thereof, the date registered and the number of the registry, and shall be provided with proper and necessary books therefor. Every person registering a male dog shall pay therefor the sum of \$2.00 and every female dog the sum of \$4.00, the town marshall shall be entitled to the sum of twenty-five cents (25¢) for every male or female dog so registered, and the balance of all moneys received by said town marshall for registration fees shall, after deducting all expenses and fees provided by this ordinance be paid over to the Town Treasurer at the end of each month to be kept by said Town Treasurer in a separate account to be known as the "Dog Fund", against which fund all orders for costs, charges and expenses incurred under this ordinance must be drawn and charged.

Sec. 3. The town marshall shall provide metallic tags, numbered consecutively commencing with number, one, and upon which shall be stamped in addition to the number the words, "Culbertson Mont." and also the year in which said tag is issued and said town marshall shall deliver to each person registrying a dog one of such tags for

each dog so registered and for which a license is paid and the number on the tag so issued shall correspond with the registration number of the dog for which said tag is issued, and it shall be the duty of the owner of any dog so registered to fasten such tag upon the collar of the dog for which such tag is issued.

sec. 4. The town marshall of the town of Culbertson shall provide, at the Town's expense a safe, suitable and retired place for impounding and care of dogs as herein provided.

Sec. 5. It shall be the duty of the town marshall to kill or impound every dog running at large in the streets or alleys of said town of Culbertson unless such dog is registered and has on it a collar and tag as provided in this ordinance. The owner of every registered dog shall at all times be fully liable for any and all pecuniary damages caused by such animal.

Sec. 6. Any dog having the appearance of being mad or any unregistered dog found doing damage to any person or property, shall be killed forthwith. In other cases the proper officers may, in their descretion impound any male dog, or, female dog that may seem to have intrinsic value or commercial value found running the streets in violation of this ordinance. If no person claims such animal within twenty-four hours from the time the same is impounded, the marshall must post in three public places in the town, a notice that said animal will be sold at the expiration of ten days from the date of said notice and must at the expiration of said ten days sell said animal to the highest bidder. If there be no bidder, such animal shall be killed. If within the time an owner appears and claims the animal, he or she shall pay all charges; and if a resident of the town, shall be required to register such animal before it is surrendered, and in case such dog is sold as hereinbefore provided and the owner thereof appears at any time within six months from the date of such sale and proves his property, he may reclaim the same by paying to the purchaser of such dog at such sale the purchas price of said dog and all costs and charges occasioned thereby.



ORDINANCE NUMBER 4

22 marshall must post ~~there~~ in three public places in the town, a notice  
23 that said animal will be sold at the expiration of five days from  
24 the date of said notice and must at the expiration of said five  
25 days, sell said animal to the highest bidder. If there be no bidder,  
26 such animal shall be killed. If within the time an owner appears  
27 and claims the animal, he or she shall pay all charges; and if a re-  
28 sident of the town, shall be required to register such animal before  
29 it is surrendered.

30 Sec. 7. Said Marshall shall be entitled to collect and receive  
31 the following fees. For each and every dog reclaimed, the sum of  
32 one dollar from the owner or claimant thereof. For each and every dog  
33 killed the sum of one dollar to be paid by the town. Said Marshall  
34 shall, at the first meeting of the Council in each month report in writ-  
35 ting, under oath, the number of dogs by him impounded during the



1 the previous month, number reclaimed and amount of fees paid therefor.  
 2 Also the number by him destroyed and amount due for same, which amount  
 3 shall be paid from dog fund herein before ~~treated~~, <sup>stated</sup> so long as moneys  
 4 remain in said fund and thereafter from the general fund, provid-  
 5 ed, that any person who has paid for a tag for his dog for the current  
 6 year shall not be required to pay any charge for impounding.  
 7

8 Sec. 8. The unauthorized removal of a tag from any dog after  
 9 the same has been placed thereon, shall be ~~guilty of violating this~~ <sup>deemed a violation of</sup>  
 10 ordinance and <sup>any person</sup> upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not  
 11 less than five dollars nor more than twenty-five dollars for each  
 12 offence.

13 Sec. 9. Any known vicious or dangerous dog running at large  
 14 and not securely muzzled, whether tagged or untagged, shall be sub-  
 15 ject to summary destruction if in the opinion of the police authorities  
 16 the public safety requires. *after ten days from the date of said notice and removal at the expiration of*

17 Sec. 10. The mayor of the Town of Culbertson may by proclama-  
 18 tion, whenever in his opinion the public safety requires, direct  
 19 the muzzling of all dogs for a limited time, and during such period  
 20 no unmuzzled dog shall run at large whether tagged or untagged and  
 21 in such event it is made the duty of the Town Marshall to forthwith  
 22 destroy or impound any unmuzzled dog found running at large within  
 23 the limits of the Town of Culbertson.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 5

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING OFFENSES AGAINST GOOD ORDER AND MORALS.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the town of Culbertson:

Sec. 1. That any person within the limit of the town of Culbertson, who shall wilfully, and maliciously or intentionally and unnecessarily disturb the peace or quiet of any street, neighborhood, family or person, by loud or unusual noises, vocal or instrumental, or shall make false alarms by crying "fire", or shall threaten, quarrel, scold, halloo, or shall provoke or commit an assault, or an assault and battery or by any other means whatever disturb the peace, or who shall wantonly and cruelly abuse any animal, or utter any obscene, vulgar and indecent language shall be deemed guilty of violating this ordinance, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than five dollars nor more than one-hundred dollars.

Sec. 2. Any person knowingly allowing any disturbance described in the foregoing section, upon premises owned or occupied by him or her, shall be deemed guilty of violating this ordinance, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than five dollars nor more than one-hundred dollars. day of Nov. A.D., 1909.

Sec. 3. carded ashes, boxes, papers, cans and bottles. All other garbage

No person or persons shall, within this town, or within three miles of the town limits keep a bawdy house or house of ill-fame, or, house of lewd resort, or other house or building for the resort of prostitutes or of persons for the purpose of prostitution or to associate with prostitutes or lewd persons; nor shall any person or persons permit any tenement, building, or premises in his or her possession or under his or her control to be used for any such purpose; and any person who shall keep such house or shall offend against any provision of this section shall for each offence, on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than one-hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the town jail for a term not to exceed thirty days, or both such fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the court.
